
## Fine Arts

#### **Athletics**



## Special Education

The St. Joseph Catholic Academy is providing more opportunities for students with special needs, thanks to a grant from the FIRE Foundation and the hiring of a special education coordinator, Sherry Russell. Since the 2024-25 school year began, Sherry has been working with students, parents, teachers and principals, crafting accommodations to ensure that all students in the Academy succeed.

"Having a person dedicated to inclusive education within the Academy was our ultimate goal," said Natalie Newville, president of the Academy. "We were thrilled when we found out we received the grant."



Nataile said the Academy was able to hire Sherry because the FIRE grant pays half her salary.

According to its website, FIRE was founded in 1996 by a "group of parents who shared a common dream; for their children with special needs to attend their parish schools with siblings and friends." Since FIRE's founding, more than \$7 million has been granted to schools in the Diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph "to support inclusive Catholic education."

Sherry came into the Academy special education coordinator position with a broad background of teaching in both public and charter schools in New Mexico. She had taught in the St. Joseph School District since moving to St. Joseph in 2018.

Her connections with the school district have been helpful, Sherry said, because she works closely with the district for student testing, resources and programs. She said she also works closely and meets with other special education coordinators at Catholic schools in the Kansas City-St. Joseph Diocese.

Since she began her duties, Sherry has been creating student education plans for Academy students with a broad range of learning disabilities, and helping to connect parents and teachers with resources. The Academy also has several students who are English Language Learners, and Sherry is helping them with accommodations, as well.

"A lot of my job is being open to figuring out what students need," she said, "and getting that information to parents and teachers."

Along with the funding, Sherry said, FIRE also provides multiple resources to the Academy, such as books and technology. The foundation is also paying for her to take online courses to learn about Universal Design for Learning (UDL) from Notre Dame University. She noted that FIRE will support Academy teachers to take the courses, as well. "UDL teaches how to meet students where they are; it's a whole different way of teaching and learning."

Becky and Bill Rippe are parents of three current St. Francis Xavier School students, and thanks to the FIRE Foundation, their youngest son, who has Down syndrome, will be able to attend kindergarten next fall at St. Francis Xavier because FIRE is funding a paraprofessional for him. Becky said when he was three months old, she began her research to figure out how he could attend the same school with his siblings, and she discovered FIRE.

"I contacted them and told them I wanted him to go to school with his siblings, and they told me, 'that's what we're here for,'" Becky said. "I'm just so excited for him to be included and learn about God, and to have his siblings there to pave his path."

Becky, who serves as a Friend of FIRE liaison, is happy to see so many Academy students already benefiting from the hiring of Sherry and the FIRE grant, and is looking forward to seeing how many more students will be helped in the future. Natalie said the Academy will submit reports to the foundation and re-apply for funding each year.

"This has been a great opportunity for the Academy," Sherry said of her position and the support from FIRE. "We are figuring out what students need and how to get them where they need to be."



# High Five Mondays

Throughout October, LeBlond seniors had the chance to visit their alma maters, meeting with current students to offer encouragement and start their week on a positive note! "High Five Mondays" brought together elementary and high school students, creating a fun and meaningful opportunity for interaction. Many of our younger students look up to their high school role models, and this new tradition fosters connections that inspire and uplift both our young and older scholars alike.







## MO Scholars Reception



Catholic school advocates gathered at the MO Scholars Reception with Bishop James V. Johnston to gain deeper insights into the program and explore ways to bolster its impact.

For the 2024-2025 school year, the Academy welcomed over 170 MO Scholars, generating more than \$1 million in tuition support. These scholars include students from legacy families and new families who recognize the value of Catholic education in shaping their children's future and fostering community values.

The MO Scholars program is funded through the Bright Futures Fund, which allows individuals and businesses to redirect their Missouri tax payments directly to support Catholic education.

The impact of this program is already evident. At the start of the summer, one hopeful student expressed to school staff that they had been praying for the chance to attend a Catholic school. When they learned they had received MO Scholars funding, their dream came true. This transformative effect on Catholic education is only possible with community supporters utilizing the Bright Futures tax credits, underscoring the powerful role of faith and generosity in shaping educational opportunities.

A message from our Pastoral Coordinator, Fr. Stephen Hansen:
